

**STATE OF TENNESSEE  
COUNTY OF HAMBLLEN  
CORPORATION OF MORRISTOWN  
MARCH 18, 2008**

The City Council for the City of Morristown, Hamblen County, Tennessee, met in regular session at the regular meeting place of the Council in the Morristown City Center at 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, March 18, 2008 with Honorable Vice Mayor Kay Senter presiding and the following named Councilmembers present: Claude Jinks, Frank McGuffin, William Rooney, Rick Trent and Mel Tucker; absent: Mayor Barbara C. "Sami" Barile.

Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to approve the March 4, 2008 minutes as circulated; Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and all voted "aye".

A public hearing was conducted on the 2008 Community Development Block Grant Draft Action Plan. There were no public comments.

A public hearing was held on the proposed amendment to the Morristown-Hamblen County 20 Year Growth Plan to include the Cornerstone Academy property on Jacobs Road and the Russellville Dollar Store at 5635 East Andrew Johnson Hwy. into the Urban Growth Boundary Area. {Roger Odom, representing Cornerstone Academy, stated that the Wallace property between their property and Davy Crockett Parkway was going to be included in the annexation; no intent to go down Jacobs Road.} There were no other public comments. Councilmember Rooney made a motion to approve the two amendments to the Growth Boundary; Councilmember McGuffin seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Councilmembers McGuffin, Rooney, Trent, Tucker and Vice Mayor Senter voted "aye"; Councilmember Jinks voted "no".

Councilmember Rooney made a motion to award the bid for the construction contract for the Old Russellville Pike Sanitary Sewer Extension to the low bidder – M.G. Hall, LLC in the amount of \$189,998. Councilmember Tucker seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Tucker made a motion to award the proposal for engineering services for the Turkey Creek Interceptor Phase II and Phase III to McGill Associates in the amount of \$147,600 for Phase II and \$102,900 for Phase III. Councilmember Jinks seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to adopt the following captioned Ordinance No. 3321 on first reading and schedule a public hearing relative to

final passage of said Ordinance for April 1, 2008. Councilmember Trent seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted “aye”.

**Ordinance No. 3321**

**Entitled an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of the City of Morristown, Tennessee, Appendix B. {Rezoning of property located at the corner of Brights Pike and Davy Crockett Parkway, Parcel 46.02, HCTM 25, from Medium Density Residential (R-2) to Intermediate Business (IB).}**

Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to adopt the following captioned Ordinance No. 3322 on first reading and schedule a public hearing relative to final passage of said Ordinance for April 1, 2008. Councilmember Jinks seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted “aye”.

**Ordinance No. 3322**

**Entitled an Ordinance to amend the Municipal Code of the City of Morristown, Tennessee, Appendix B. {Rezoning of property located at 2828 Cherokee Park Road, Parcel 17, HCTM 17, from Medium Density Residential (R-2) to Intermediate Business (IB).}**

Councilmember Tucker made a motion to adopt the following captioned Ordinance No. 3323 on first reading and schedule a public hearing relative to final passage of said Ordinance for April 1, 2008. Councilmember McGuffin seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted “aye”.

**Ordinance No. 3323**

**Entitled an Ordinance to annex certain territory and to incorporate same within the corporate boundaries of the City of Morristown, Tennessee. {Annexation and Zoning Classification of Veterans Parkway and the Barile property being Parcel 98, HCTM 48 as Heavy Industrial (HI).}**  
*(Corrective action on Ordinance No. 3270 adopted 2/20/07.)*

Councilmember McGuffin made a motion to adopt the following captioned Ordinance No. 3324 on first reading and schedule a public hearing relative to final passage of said Ordinance for April 1, 2008. Councilmember Trent seconded the motion. Councilmember Rooney made a motion to amend the Ordinance by striking the words “unto the adjoining property owners, their successors and assigns” from Section II of the Ordinance; Councilmember Trent seconded the motion to amend and all voted “aye”. Upon roll call, all voted “aye” on the Ordinance as amended.

**Ordinance No. 3324**

**Entitled an Ordinance to close and vacate certain rights-of-way within the City of Morristown. {Right-of-Way Closing: A portion of South Daisy Street.} (Corrective action on Ordinance No. 3288 adopted 5/15/07.)**

Councilmember Tucker made a motion to adopt the following captioned Ordinance No. 3320 on second and final reading. Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and upon roll call, Councilmembers Jinks, Rooney, Tucker and Vice Mayor Senter voted “aye”; Councilmembers McGuffin and Trent voted “no”.

**Ordinance No. 3320  
Entitled an Ordinance to amend the Morristown Municipal Code, Title 18 – Water and Sewers, by adding Chapter 5 - Stormwater Utility Service Charges.**

Councilmember Tucker brought up the red light cameras under unfinished business. The Police Department will look at the intersections where the cameras will be located to see whether they meet the criteria on timing count for the lights, good site visibility, etc., and prepare a report for City Council.

The board/commission appointments were postponed until the next Council meeting due to the absence of Mayor Barile.

Vice Mayor Senter adjourned the March 18, 2008 City Council meeting.
