

**STATE OF TENNESSEE

CORPORATION OF MORRISTOWN
NOVEMBER 2, 2010**

The City Council for the City of Morristown, Hamblen County, Tennessee, met in regular session at the regular meeting place of the Council in the Morristown City Center at 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, November 2, 2010 with Honorable Mayor Barbara C. "Sami" Barile, presiding and the following named Councilmembers present: Gene Brooks, Bob Garrett, Claude Jinks, Frank McGuffin, William Rooney and Kay Senter.

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to approve the October 19, 2010 minutes as circulated; Councilmember Rooney seconded the motion and all voted "aye".

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to amend the agenda and add naming of the new airport terminal building; Councilmember Senter seconded the motion and all voted "aye".

Chief Overholt updated Council on Codes Enforcement activity (9/9/10 – 10/29/10). Properties/residences - 214 have been identified to be in violation of City Codes, 143 notices have been issued, 116 brought into compliance, 24 are under notice of violation, 11 have been identified as foreclosures, 71 are pending initial contact, and 7 have been cited into court. Vehicles - 43 tagged as abandoned and/or junk, 26 removed by owner, 4 removed by Codes Enforcement, and 13 remain under notice; Farmers Market – continuing to work with vendors at the market.

Report from Dynise Robertson, Finance Director, on funding for the County Property Reappraisal Invoice (\$116,388). Recommended increasing prior year property tax revenue by \$23,250; increasing delinquent property tax revenue by \$23,250; increasing other revenue by \$63,500 and decreasing the Finance Department expenses by \$6,388. A budget amendment reflecting these figures will be prepared for consideration at the November 16, 2010 Council meeting.

Mayor Barile appointed Sara Turk to the Tree Board to fill the remainder of Anne Doka's term which will expire September 18, 2013. Councilmember Senter made a motion to approve the appointment; Councilmember Jinks seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Jinks made a motion to approve the amendment to the Vaughn & Melton Engineering Contract for the I-81/Exit 8 Sewer Utility Relocation in the amount of \$130,216.25. Councilmember McGuffin seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Councilmember Senter made a motion to name the new airport terminal building "*The Evelyn Bryan Johnson Terminal*" in honor of Ms. Johnson's 101st birthday (11/4/10) to recognize her lifetime accomplishments in aviation and her contributions to the field of aviation. Councilmember Jinks seconded the motion and upon roll call, all voted "aye".

Mayor Barile adjourned the November 2, 2010 City Council meeting.
