

Activities to be Undertaken

Public Facilities \$100,000

Frank Lorino Park

Frank Lorino is one of the busiest parks in the City of Morristown. Currently the park is used by several programs such as the youth football league and the Challenge Disability Program (this program consists of disabled persons/children). The bathrooms in this park are not ADA assessable. As you might guess, this has caused problems particularly with the before mentioned programs that use this park. There are two bathrooms at the park. One is scheduled to be remodeled to meet the ADA access required. This project will remove physical barriers the limit severely disabled people's and elderly people's access to this restroom. There is a cost estimate of \$100,000.

Public Works/ Infrastructure

In the original Action Plan we proposed \$149,000 will be invested in the infrastructure improvements in Census Tract 1003. Due to the reorganization of funds, the project has now been allocated \$182, 000. This tract is the lowest income tract in the City of Morristown and has been identified as one of the target areas. Street improvements were indicated to be a High Priority and sidewalks as a medium priority. The average household income for this neighborhood is a very low of \$15,143, according to US Census figures. The improvements would not only benefit a low and moderate income area but, will help to revitalize a blighted neighborhood and eliminate a possible health and safety hazard. This project will also contribute to meeting the American Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.
